Weaving instructor, **Phyllis Narus of Georgetown, Tennessee**, has been weaving since 1996 and has studied with weaving enthusiasts Deborah Chandler of Guatemala, Elaine Bradley of Georgia, Beth Smathers of Oklahoma, Emily Dewhirst and Judy Smith-Rowland both of Tennessee. She is a member of the Handweavers Guild of America, Chattahoochee Weaving Guild of Georgia and Scenic Valley Handweavers Guild of Georgetown, Tennessee. Phyllis owns R&M Yarns in Georgetown, TN (www.rmyarns.com) and enjoys all aspects of weaving but especially the enthusiasm and excitement of beginning weavers.

This workshop is *designed for “first-time” weaving students* as well as those needing a refresher on how to “dress” a loom, but has proven to be suitable for everyone. During the three-day workshop, students will complete a project from start to finish. Areas covered will be project planning, completely “dressing” the loom for weaving, correctly holding and throwing a shuttle (with an emphasis on selvage and tension control) and other topics necessary in completing a project. The class size is kept small to allow individual attention for each student. Each new student is given a reference notebook to take home which is included in the class fee. (Returning students—please bring your notebook for new pages.) Class size is limited to 4-5 students and registration forms are taken on a “first-come, first-served” basis. *If you have questions about this 3-day workshop, please call the instructor at 423.284.8209 or email pnarus@yahoo.com.*

The Deadline for submitting Registration Forms is 2 weeks prior to the beginning of the Workshop*. Please note that the Workshops fill up quickly. A \$100.00 deposit, along with the Registration Form, will hold a spot for you in the workshop. The balance is due the first day of class.

(Sorry, but no refund of the deposit can be given if a student cancels within 1 week of the workshop. However, the registration may be transferred.)

The Workshop **MUST** have a minimum of 3 students registered for the workshop to “make.” If the workshop does not have the minimum, it will be cancelled and all deposits will be returned in a timely manner.

Lodging arrangements should be made by the individual student. If you are interested in sharing a room with another student, please check with the instructor for possibilities. Continental breakfast is usually offered at the hotel. Students should bring their own lunch. A refrigerator, microwave, toaster oven and stove are available at the Studio.

The Workshop should end Wednesday afternoon around 4-5 p.m.
